YOUTH FEATURE - "MR. ENTHUSIASM" JOHNNY SHAVER DUPLIN COUNTY & UNC-WILMINGTON!



Johnny Shaver is a 19 year old Duplin County Democrat who is a student at UNC-Wilmington. Johnny is excited about greatly increasing Democratic participation by Hispanic youth as well as youth of all nationalities.

His goal in Duplin County is to see at least one Hispanic person serving on a Town Board. He went to the Board of Elections office to file for a seat on the Board of the town of Magnolia. However, he learned that he was two years too young to file because a candidate must be at least 21.

Johnny said he wants to serve in public office because of "the change you can make in your community, the good you can do."

At James Kenan High School he was President of his freshman class, President of his sophomore class, and Secretary of his junior class.

Maria says Johnny has had his mind set on political activities since he was five. "When we picked someone for President, he would be so interested," she says. "I don't know where he gets it from but I'm so proud of him and support him."

"He doesn't have limits," Maria says. "He can keep going and help so many people. He is always trying to help people get their rights."



He Is SENATOR SHAVER now!


This Fall Johnny entered UNC-Wilmington on a Grow Your Own Scholarship. He is going to major in History Education.

He ran in a field of six candidates for one Senate seat in the UNC-Wilmington Student Government. His classmates recognized his leadership abilities and they elected him over the other five candidates!

After graduating he plans to return to Duplin County and teach in Duplin schools – and run for public office. The 2010 US Census found that Duplin County has a higher percentage of Hispanic residents that any other county in North Carolina – 22%.

His goal is to see at least one Hispanic person serving as a Town Board Member. "It's important to see someone who looks like you up there," he said, "and to have someone who can translate what is going on."

Johnny's hero is Cesar Chavez who championed farm workers' rights in the 1960s and 1970s. Johnny is already working with the Farm Labor Organizing Committee (FLOC) to help promote the rights of immigrants and migrant farm workers.








