State Chair Wayne Goodwin took this picture as Governor Cooper was speaking.









THE INVESTITURE OF JUSTICE MARK DAVIS!

She was "chosen for the Lifetime Achievement Award based on her years of service and dedication to eliminating racism and empowering women."



Right: Allen Thomas – Executive Director of the Global Transpark in Kinston and former Mayor of Greenville












