THE LONGEST SERVING COURT OF APPEALS JUDGE – EVER!

When Governor Jim Hunt appointed attorney Linda McGee to the North Carolina Court of Appeals in 1995, he had no way of knowing she would make history for serving on the court longer than any other Judge in the court's history – 26 amazing years!

She was elected to full eight-year terms in 1996, 2004, and 2012. In 2012 she received a strong 61.2% of the votes in the General Election. She will retire on December 31, 2020.

When asked what message she would like to send to the people of North Carolina, she replied: "It has been an honor have the opportunity to be involved with so many Judges over the years. I am pleased to have been able to serve the people of North Carolina for these 26 years."

When asked what her future plans are, she replied: "I am going to work with several voluntary organizations including the Democratic Party."

Judge McGee and her husband, Gary McGee, live in beautiful Corolla in Currituck County where he has been very active in the Democratic Party. Gary has served as First Vice Chair of the Currituck County Democratic Party and he is currently Chair of the Currituck County Board of Elections.

Scott Deming gave an inspirational address which uplifted everyone.






DEMOCRATIC WOMEN OF MECKLENBURG COUNTY!

Congratulations to DW President Nancy Hawley and all the Democratic Women of Wilson County for this excellent project!






YOUTH FEATURE - COLBY DAGENHART!
