AN ORGANIZED PRECINCT

HOW AN ORGANIZED PRECINCT WORKS:

- It take **5 active democrats** to make quorum at a precinct meeting for the purpose of organizing the precinct or electing precinct officers and members of the precinct committee at the annual precinct meeting
- **5 active democrats**

AN ORGANIZED PRECINCT

MEMBERS OF THE PRECINCT COMMITTEE

- Shall consist of at least five active Democrats who reside in the precinct when elected by the active Democrats of the precinct present at the annual precinct meeting held in odd-numbered years.
- Should bear a reasonable relationship to the make-up of the active Democrats of said precinct as to gender, age, race, ethnic background and, where practical, geography.
- All Democratic county and city elected officials and Democratic members of the North Carolina General Assembly residing in the precinct shall be ex-officio, non-voting members of the precinct committee.
- **Precinct Officers: Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary/Treasurer.**

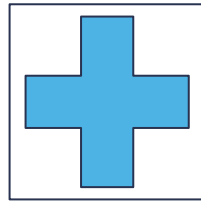
DUTIES OF PRECINCT CHAIR

CHAIR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Preside at precinct meetings;
- Establish **reasonable political goals** for the precinct;
- Organize and execute a **voter organizing plan**;
- Attend meetings of the county executive committee;
- Recommend names of persons to serve as precinct elections officials;
- Carry out other duties as may be assigned by the precinct or county executive committees;
- Transmit all records pertaining to the office to successor within ten (10) days of vacating office.

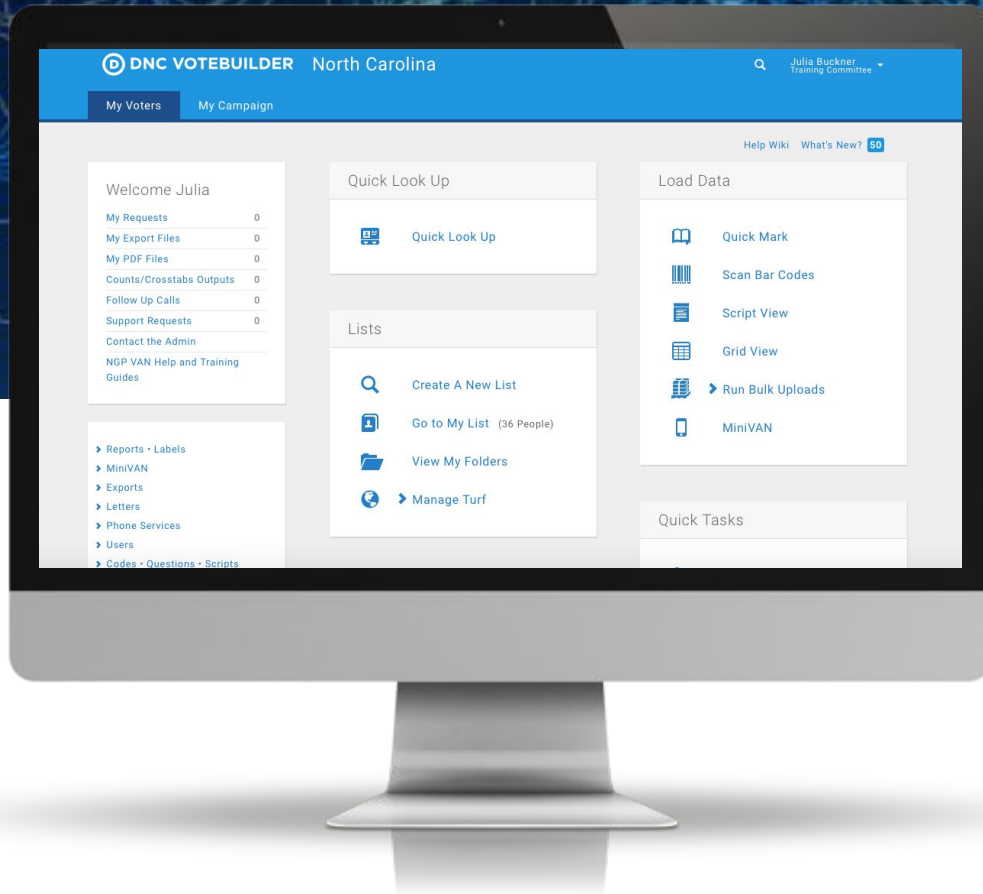

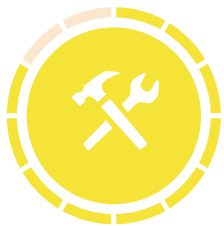

BUILD INFRASTRUCTURE → PERSONAL VOTER CONTACT → ELECTION PREP →

INFRASTRUCTURE = ALWAYS

- Recruit, Build & Train Your Team
- Welcome New Folks
- Communicate
- Make Plans & Set SMART Goals

PERSONAL VOTER CONTACT = SPRING/SUMMER

- Analyze your Data
- Set SMART Goals
 - Voting Turnout
 - Internal
- Canvass Your Neighborhood
- Presence in Your Community (Forums/Festivals)
- Socials/Meet-n-Greets

THE PRECINCT CYCLE

BUILD INFRASTRUCTURE → PERSONAL VOTER CONTACT → ELECTION PREP →

ELECTION PREP

- August: Lit Drops, Coordinate w/ Campaigns, Recruit & Train Turf Captains
- September: Canvassing w/ Turf Captain, GOTEV Dry Run(s)
- October: Canvassing for GOTV & GOTEV, Election Day Dry Run(s)
- November: GOTV, GOTV, GOTV

GET OUTSIDE THE CYCLE BOX

- Where is your precinct in 5 years?
- What will my precinct look like in 2030?
 - Development
 - Population
 - Leadership
 - Goals

NOW WHAT?

1. GET A MAP:

- Tax/Mapping Office, Dem HQ,
- Drive, Run, Walk, Cycle your precinct
 - ? Boundaries, ?Social Centers, ?Whose House Can I Borrow?
- Meet Your Neighbors & Make Friends

2. COMMUNICATE WITH OTHER DEMS

- Postcards, Letters, Emails & Handwritten TYs
- Regular communication is IMPORTANT!!!!
- Know the Issues

3. RECRUIT VOLUNTEERS/BUILD YOUR TEAM

- Skillset vs. Needs
 - Point of Contact Folks, Comm. Folks, Data Folks
 - Turf Captains, Neighborhood Leaders
 - Your next officers

- And hold X # of events

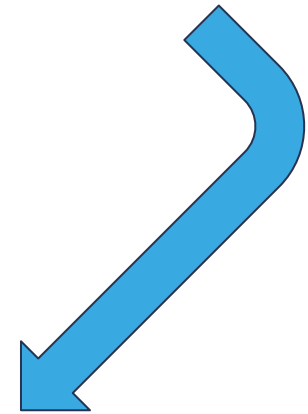

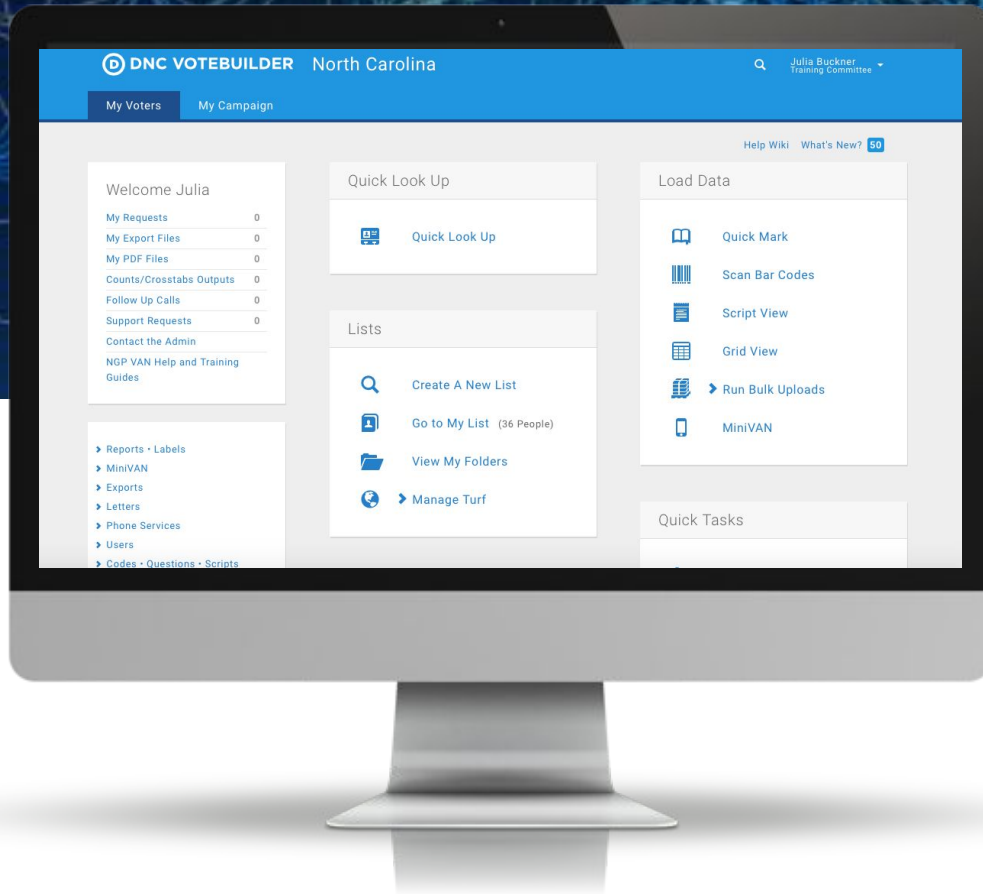
