

TJ CAWLEY ANNOUNCES HIS RE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN!

Progressive Democrat TJ Cawley, serving as Morrisville Mayor since 2017, recently announced his campaign to seek re-election.



SIG & NANCY JANE CELEBRATE!






Several years ago Justin was elected President of the Student Government at Greene County Middle School.
