Congratulations! You have been provided this application because one of North Carolina's political parties wishes to nominate you to serve as a member of a county board of elections. North Carolina law specifies: "In every county of the State there shall be a county board of elections, to consist of five persons of good moral character who are registered voters in the county in which they are to act." N.C. General Statute § 163-30. The State Board of Elections appoints four qualified persons to county boards of elections on the last Tuesday in June in odd-numbered years, and their terms of office continue two years from the date of appointment and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The fifth member is appointed by the governor to be the chair of the county board. Of the appointments by the State Board, two members each shall belong to the two political parties having the highest number of registered affiliates as reflected by the latest registration statistics published by the State Board.

To assist the State Board of Elections in considering your potential nomination, you must answer EVERY question and sign the application.

Limitations on **Political Activities**

N.C. General Statute § 163-30 states:

- (b)No person shall be eligible to serve as a member of a county board of elections who meets any of the following criteria:
 - (1)Holds any elective office under the government of the United States, or of the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision thereof.
 - (2)Holds any office in a state, congressional district, county or precinct political party or organization. Provided, however, that the position of delegate to a political party convention shall not be considered an office for the purpose of this subdivision.
 - (3)Is a campaign manager or treasurer of any candidate or political party in a primary or election.
 - (4)Is a candidate for nomination or election.
 - (5)Is the wife, husband, son, son-in-law, daughter, daughter-in-law, mother, mother-in-law, father, father-inlaw, sister, sister-in-law, brother, brother-in-law, aunt, uncle, niece, or nephew of any candidate for nomina-

tion or election. Upon any member of the board of elections becoming ineligible, that me declared vacant. This subdivision only applies if the county board of elections is conducti which the relative is a candidate.

County Board Member Responsibilities

County board members are responsible for the conduct of elections in the county. Board members can only take official action during a properly called meeting of the board and when a quorum is present. Examples of county board member duties and responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Canvassing election returns and issuing certificates of election
- Appointing precinct officials
- Establishing one-stop early voting plans
- Hiring and supervising county board of elections employees
- Supervising elections director and providing for a current delegation of duties
- Preparing and submitting elections budget to county commissioners
- Determining the sufficiency of petitions
- Approving absentee ballot applications
- Adjudicating provisional applications for provisional ballots
- Supervising hand-to-eye sample audits and recounts
- Hearing and deciding quasi-judicial matters such as voter challenges, candidate challenges, and election protests.
- Conducting board meetings in accordance with the NC Open Meetings Law
- Attending training conducted by the State Board at least once during the six months after the member's initial
 appointment and at least once again during the first two years of the member's service.
- Complying with all applicable statutes, rules, court orders, and State Board-issued guidance/memos

In odd-numbered years, elections generally take place in September, October, and November. In even-numbered years, there is a primary, second primary if needed, and a general election in November. County board members are expected to attend regular board meetings throughout the year. They are also expected to attend all absentee board meetings, which take place weekly beginning the fifth Tuesday before the election. Board members must plan to be available on Election Day and on canvass, which occurs on the tenth day after the election.
