She is the oldest of five children and she is married to Donald Moody. Their one child, a son, preceded his parents in death.


After graduating from Littleton High School, she earned her Bachelor's Degree from Shaw University.

She told the Convention, "Thank you for allowing me to serve our Party and be a part of a much needed and imperative cause."


JOHNNY SHAVER GRADUATES FROM UNC-W!

MAYA PARKER GRADUATES FROM DUKE UNIVERSITY!


Maya Parker of Martin County graduated from Duke University last week in a ceremony which featured John Legend as Commencement Speaker

SEAN EWING, SECOND VICE CHAIR!





ELLEN EDWARDS, TREASURER




Jayne moved to Kannapolis which was her mother's hometown and has rented the same house for more than 20 years. She has five children.
