


STEP TWO: A menu that looks like this will appear. Click **"Raise hand"**






RAISING YOUR HAND ON YOUR PHONE

LITIGATION UPDATES

1. Redistricting

2 consolidated cases - Racial and partisan gerrymandering Opinion due Tuesday, Jan. 11.

2. Voter ID

3 separate cases - 2 in state court, 1 in federal
Law has been stayed, is NOT in force
Cases are waiting on 2 issues: Whether GOP Leg. can intervene
Whether GOP Justices should recuse

3. Felon Disenfranchisement

Community Success Initiative v. Moore

Preliminary injunction – Can now vote if only owe fines

Larger preliminary injunction was stayed

Case is waiting for full written decision by the Superior Court

Voter registration matters in North Carolina.

- By registering voters, we are expanding the electorate
- Expanding the electorate is one of the most effective ways to close the vote gap






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




LEGAL OVERVIEW

DO

- Assign forms in batches to volunteers
- Log forms assigned and completed for each volunteer
- Assist voters, IF REQUESTED
- Have voters fully complete
 and sign each form
- Send each form to the County BOE
 within 5 days of receipt. Must be rovd.
 25 days before E-Day
- Send any form filled out by a Voter to the County BOE regardless of whether it is complete





LEGAL OVERVIEW

DO NOT:

- Compensate based on forms completed
- Coerce a voter to select a party preference
- Pre-fill any form, unless specifically requested
- Assist voters, unless specifically requested
- Sign for voters
- Say a person must re-register in order to vote





LEGAL OVERVIEW

DO NOT:

- Fill in incomplete forms
- Retain filled in forms for any purpose
- Sell forms or related information
- Record a voter's:
 - Signature
 - Social Security Number
 - Date of Birth
 - Drivers License Number
 - Email Address





WHO CAN REGISTER IN NORTH CAROLINA



Be 18 years old by the General Election



Be a United States citizen



Be a NC resident and resident of county they're registering in



WHO CAN'T REGISTER

YOU <u>CANNOT</u> REGISTER IF YOU:

 Are currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction, including probation, parole, or post-release supervision

YOU CAN REGISTER IF YOU:

• If you have completed <u>all parts of your sentence</u> for a felony conviction or have been pardoned, you are eligible to vote in North Carolina.

(You may now register and vote if you are serving an extended term of probation, post-release supervision due to outstanding fines, fees or restitution and you do not know of any other reason the probation, post-release supervision or parole was extended.)



NORTH CAROLINA VR FORM

You will need

- Proof of Citizenship
- Don't forget: Applicants should register at the address where they live, not their P.O. Box or Student Union Mailbox. There is a separate box for mailing address.

FEDERAL VR FORM

- Federal law allows citizens to register for federal elections without providing documentary proof of citizenship.
- An applicant can register with the federal VR form with the last four digits of their Social Security Number.
- Eligible to vote for federal candidates only (President, US House, US Senate)
- Our preference is to have voters fill out the North Carolina VR Form.



IMPORTANT DATES

The regular deadline to register is 25 days before an election in NC

GETTING IN THE VR MINDSET

- Registering voters is powerful and important
- You are providing a service to the community by making it easy and convenient for people to vote
- Registering voters is how we win
- Be hungry for VR forms and ready to hustle for every single form



Be ready to register every voter, everywhere.



GETTING IN THE VR MINDSET

- Be enthusiastic, energetic and positive
- Themed VR events keep things fresh and fun for volunteers
- Have fun and think outside the box! Make your own hype







PREPARATION MATERIALS

Always have an abundance of:

- Forms
- Clipboards
- Pens

Use two clipboards (or more!) so you can register multiple people at once







PREPARATION MATERIALS

- Crowdsource location from volunteers
- Do research online and on social media to find events
- Use a hotspot tracker to keep track of potential locations and peak hours
- Consider:
 - When do people have time to register to vote?
 - Who needs to register to vote?



VR KEY COMPONENTS

Walk in one's path

Step in front of walkers as they approach you. It encourages them to stop and listen.

Walk with people

Walk alongside people. If they're in a hurry, say you can walk with them!

Engage groups

Address every member of a group; don't let one person speak for all of their friends



MAKING THE ASK: BODY LANGUAGE

- Make eye contact
- Smile!
- Be approachable
- Get clipboard in their hand
- Always stand in front of table

Walk voters through each field of the form.








MAKING THE ASK: LANGUAGE

- Always ask: "Are you registered to vote at your current address?"
- If they say no, put the clipboard in their hands and begin walking through the form!
- Don't give people an out
- Be assumptive and assertive
- Match the tone of the person you're registering; be a social chameleon

Make registering to vote easy!

RECRUITING AND TRAINING VOLUNTEERS

TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: PREP

Clipboards should have:

- VR forms
- VR Best Practices handout
- VR Legal Overview handout
- Tally sheet
- Volunteer sign up





TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: AGENDA

- Sign in
- Welcome and introductions
- Review materials on clipboard
- Why do we register voters?
- Who can register and the form
- Modeling conversation
- Roleplay
- Questions and best practice sharing



TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: SETTING EXPECTATIONS

- Volunteers should collect 2-3 VR forms per shift
- Set a team goal for VR forms during the training
- When making confirm calls, remind volunteers to:
 - Wear comfortable shoes
 - Be present in the community for 2-3 hours
 - Dress for the weather
 - Wear sunscreen
 - Bring water



TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE

Check in throughout shift:

- Listen to ask and give feedback
- Model an effective ask
- Reiterate and reset expectations
- Make sure they're having fun

Debrief with every volunteer:

- Make sure they know their work mattered
- Get input on ask and location
- Reshift!





TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: ACCURATE FORMS

- It is imperative that VR forms are **filled out** accurately and in full.
- We disenfranchise voters if they believe they are registered, when in reality, their form was not filled out correctly.
- Volunteers should walk through each step of the VR form, and review every form they collect before the person walks away.
- Review volunteer forms at the end of each shift.
 Coach volunteers struggling with accurate and complete forms.



TRAINING VOLUNTEERS: CONTINUAL THINKING

- VR is a learned skill; it takes time to get good at
- Focus on training and re-training volunteers
- Facilitate time and space for volunteers to learn from each other
 - Pair volunteers up based on experience and skill
 - Provide opportunity to share best practices





SCENARIO 1

The Disillusioned Voter

- You're out registering voters at the bus stop. When you ask a young man to vote, he says,"I don't want to vote. My vote doesn't matter. The system is rigged."
- Find a partner and roleplay this conversation!
 - 2 mins partner 1 practices
 - 1 min listener shares feedback
 - 2 mins partner 2 practices
 - 1 min listener shares feedback



SCENARIO 2

Now's Not a Good Time

- You ask a woman if she's registered to vote at her current address. She says she's not; she just moved.
 You get ready to hand her your clipboard when she says, "Now's not a good time. I'm late for an appointment. Can I take a form and send it in myself?"
- Find a **DIFFERENT** partner and roleplay this conversation!
 - 2 mins partner 1 practices
 - 1 min listener shares feedback
 - 2 mins partner 2 practices
 - 1 min listener shares feedback
