BRUNSWICK GOLF - A BIG SUCCESS!

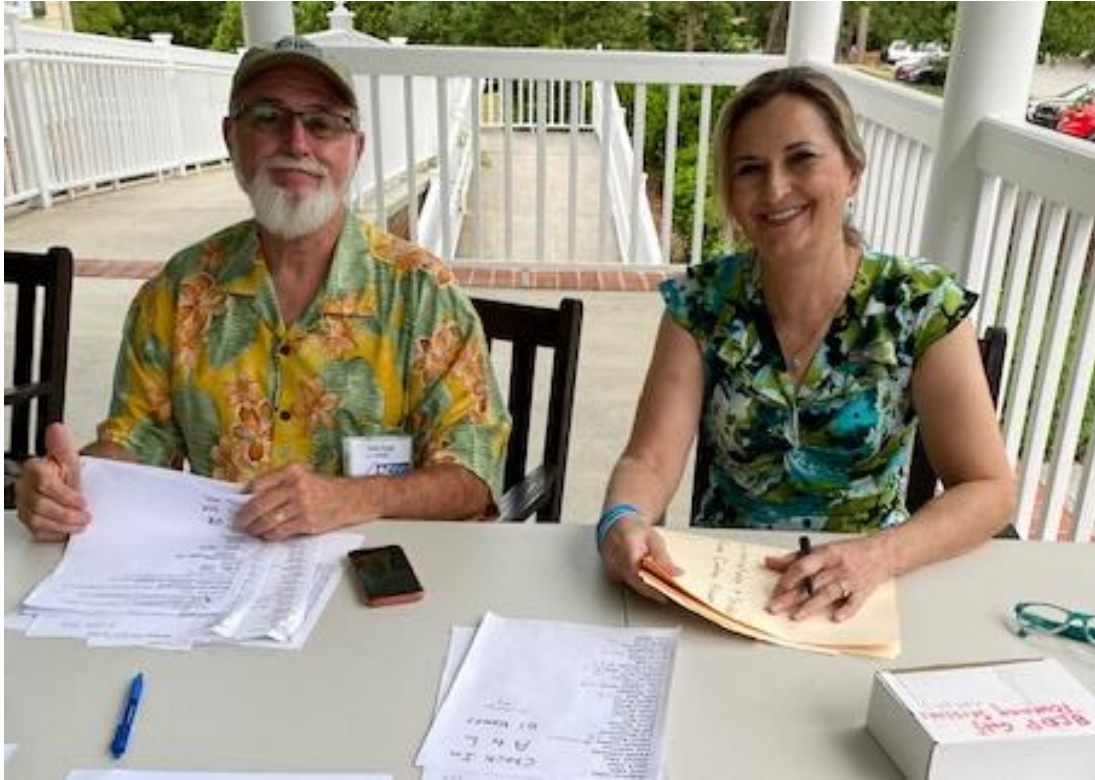
The 5th Brunswick County Democratic Party Golf Tournament was held on Sunday, May 22nd at Carolina National Golf Club and it was a huge success!

In May Apex Town Council Member Cheryl Stallings won the Democratic Primary for Wake County Commissioner in District Three. She is campaigning in the countywide race for this District's Commissioner seat in the November General Election.

Cheryl says: "I am running for office because I believe very strongly in public service working for the public good. I am a North Carolina native and I grew up in the northeastern part of the state in the farming community of Belvidere. I attended NC State and East Carolina universities. With the support of my family and with the help of financial aid, scholarships, and part time jobs, I earned a doctorate degree and became a school psychologist."

She continues: "After graduation, I worked in a number of public schools (including Wake County) providing mental health services to children and families, and consultation services to teachers and administrators. My husband, Mark, and I have lived in Wake County for over 30 years (having lived in Zebulon, Raleigh, and now Apex.)"



Cheryl says “We chose Apex as the place to raise our son Charlie because of the friendly people, great schools, and small town charm of the downtown. I am happy to say that Charlie is a product of the Wake County Public School system. A graduate from UNC-Charlotte with a computer science degree, he is now working on his MBA at UNC-Chapel Hill.

The young lady in this picture is Charlie’s girlfriend, Meredith. They are also joined by their fast-growing dog named Chief.

When Charlie was in pre-school, Cheryl joined a mental health practice in Raleigh and became co-owner as well. She has been providing mental health services to children, adolescents, adults, and families in Wake County at this business location since 2000.

In 2019 Cheryl ran for and won a seat on the Apex Town Council. She relates: “I have enjoyed my time on the Council as we have worked to help mitigate the negative impact of COVID for our residents, business owners, and town staff. Additionally, we have worked to address infrastructure needs; housing affordability; diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives; and responsible growth within the context of environmental stewardship while carefully monitoring our school capacity and traffic needs.

“In sum I think my professional and local government experiences have given me a strong skill set for the County Commissioner role. I want to partner with the current Board to help provide more equitable opportunity for a healthy and sustainable economy, community, and environment for all.

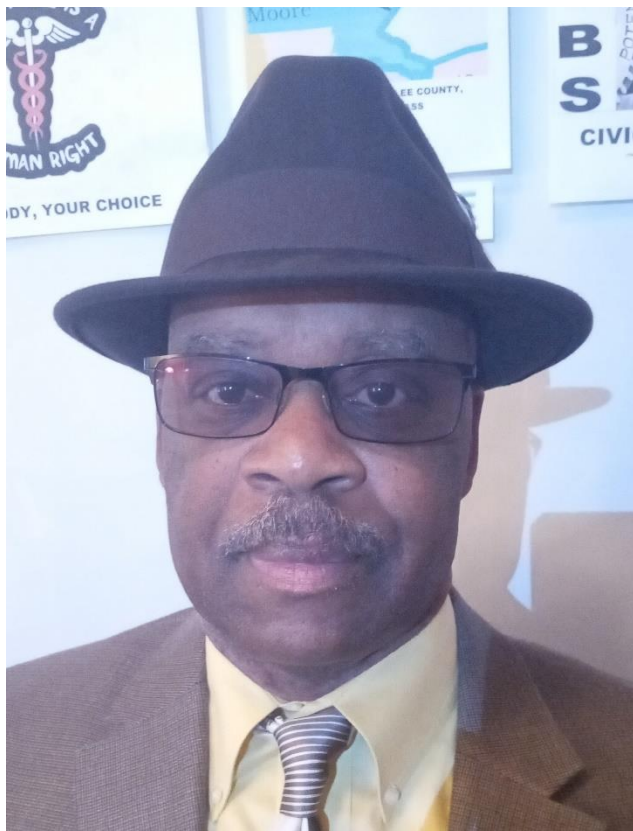
In her spare time, Cheryl enjoys being at the beach, spending time with family and friends, reading, exercising, and gardening.

"I was born and raised in Pennsylvania. For the past 18 years I have been living in Carthage. I continue to be an advocate for human rights when it comes to equity, inclusion, diversity, healthcare, public schooling, LGBTQ+ rights and infrastructure.

In 1983 the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation hired me and during my employment, I held the position of Vice President/Chief Steward. This appointment involved contract negotiations and protecting workers rights.



“After retiring from PennDOT, I pursued my dream of becoming a full-time sports official. I was involved in Minor League Baseball from the east coast to the west coast, Minor League Football (helping the Portland Shockwave, an all female full contact football team), and also did contract sports assignments for the Portland, Oregon military personnel, NCAA Baseball and officiated in several youth organizations during my travels.

“I moved to North Carolina in April of 2005 and began working at First Health Moore Regional Hospital in January of 2007. I continued working Collegiate baseball at the NCAA & Collegiate Club level. Before the pandemic hit, I also officiated different age groups for Moore County Parks and Recreation.

“In November, 2021, the Town of Carthage Commissioners unanimously approved my appointment to the Town of Carthage Appearance Committee.

“I am running for the NC House District 51 because the district needs a voice that represents all of its citizens and will support the Governor. Climate is a real and present threat economically and physically. Treating your neighbor as an equal can’t be just words but must be shown in our actions.

“Partisan politics is about control. We must put an end to that and start listening to each other and make decisions that are for the common good.

“I am about truth. I will not lie to you. I will listen and respond accordingly. If I don’t know the answer, I will find a way to get one.

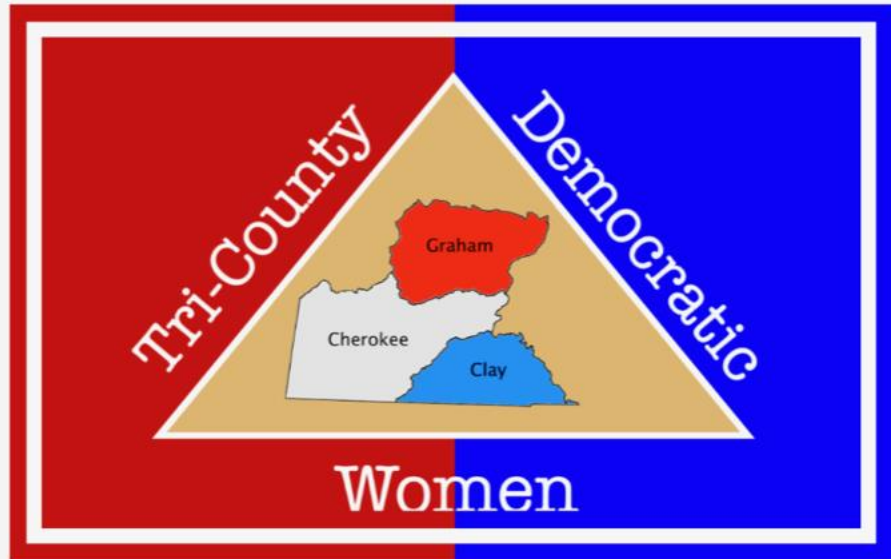

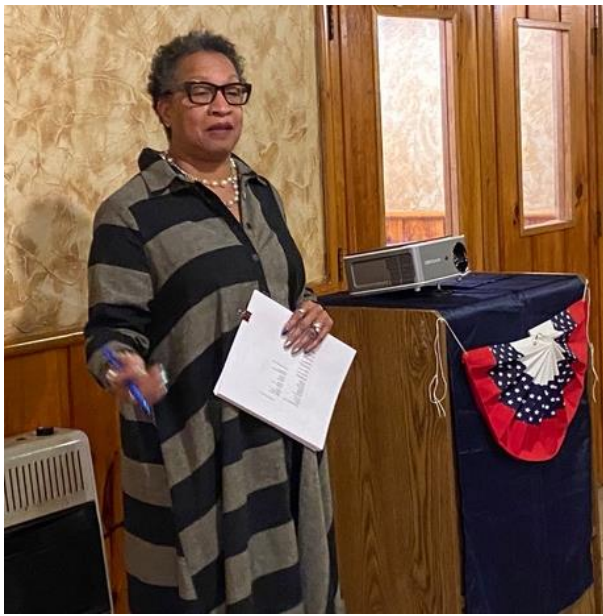


SPECIAL FEATURE – DEMOCRATIC WOMEN OF CHEROKEE, CLAY, & SWAIN COUNTIES!
