Ranlo is a town of 4,511 where Dems are showing that they can rise and win in smaller towns.

Back in 2019, Gaston County Democrats helped Jamie Fowler and Katie Cordell win two of the three available seats on the town's Board of Commissioners. This flipped the Board to blue for the first time! Robin Conner was already the first African American woman to serve on the Board. Jamie Fowler was the first open member of the LGTB+ community to get on the Board.

Ranlo Democrats have been making lots of progress over the last three years despite the pandemic. In 2021 they elected a progressive young Democrat, Trevoy Hay, who replaced Robin Conner.

In June the Board passed for the first time two proclamations recognizing Juneteenth and Pride month with applause from the audience. Despite all the anti-LGBT actions of other towns in Gaston County such as Gastonia and Gaston County itself, Ranlo has been the Democratic example



throughout the county of what grass roots organizing can accomplish. Both of the pictures above were made after both proclamations were adopted by the town's Board.



## NEW CATAWBA SECRETARY!



Jimmy Cochran has been Chair of the Lenoir County Party since 2011. He is an excellent leader and organizer.





Incumbent City Council Member Dimple Ajmera and Council candidate Stephanie Hand. Stephanie was the Keynote Speaker of the rally.


Everyone cheered loudly for former State Representative Chrissy Clark who is campaigning to reclaim her legislative seat.
