102 YEAR OLD VOTER IN CHEROKEE!

On a bright, sunny day that brought nearly 50 people to the Birdtown Early Voting site in Swain County, there was a DIFFERENCE OF A FULL CENTURY between the oldest and the youngest person at the polls.

One couple brought their two year-old daughter inside to watch them vote while outside, a poll worker took voting materials to the curb for Evelyn Owle Roberts who is 102!

Although she appears small and frail,



Ms. Roberts' memories are strong. She can tell you about growing up and going to school in the 1920s with seven brothers and three sisters in Cherokee where her father owned a mill on what is now called Adams Creek. When Ms. Evelyn was 18, she went to visit a friend in Pennsylvania, got a job at an aircraft factory and stayed up North.

MEETING EINSTEIN

At some point, she remembers meeting Albert Einstein at a friend's house in Princeton, NJ. Asked what they talked about, she smiles. "Life," she replied.

Ms. Evelyn was married for 50 years to a man who was a fireman, pharmacist and bookkeeper. They had two sons. Ms. Evelyn worked for decades at a coat factory. She eventually retired at age 65, worked some more, and retired again at age 85. Then she came back home to Cherokee.

Asked about politics, Ms. Evelyn says she's a Democrat. She remembers President Roosevelt, but the first president she voted for was "that general." She forgets his name – Eisenhower.

After that she voted for Kennedy. Since then she's been voting every chance she gets. "It's important to vote. You want to get the right people in" she says. She firmly believes that voting is especially important for young people.

Compared with Ms. Evelyn, we're all young people!

YOUTH FEATURE: MONTRAVIAS KING!

Montravias King is finishing a book about his already remarkable life. It will be entitled *BEYOND THE BALLOT: RESILIENCE DEFINED*. It is certain to be a fascinating volume because so far Montravias has lived a fascinating life.

In 2013 the name "Montravias King" was on the lips of everyone in North Carolina's political world. When he was summoned to the stage at a SEC meeting in Charlotte that year, he received one of the longest ovations in the history of the organization!

Why? As a 22 year-old student at Elizabeth City State University he filed for a seat on the City Council of Elizabeth City. Opponents, including the county's GOP Chair, objected to the legitimacy of his filing because his address was a college dormitory. They persuaded the Pasquotank County Board of Elections to disqualify him.



With national media attention spurred by Rachel Maddow, Montravias appealed to the State Board of Elections which ruled in his favor.

He was subsequently elected by an overwhelming vote!

Montravias soon became a frequent guest commentator for Huffington Post Live, the HBCU Nation radio show, the *New York Times,* the *Washington Post*, BET News and other national news media.

Unfortunately, the racists would not let the matter rest. When he graduated they initiated a hiring boycott which prevented Montravias from getting any job in Elizabeth City – even at McDonald's. He had to resign from the City Council before the two-year term ended. He moved to Charlotte to find a job.

Since then he has taught history and civics in North Carolina public schools. He has also worked for Senator Natalie Murdock and Senator Sydney Batch.

LOST 163 POUNDS!

On Thanksgiving Day in 2020 Montravias fell asleep at the wheel which led to an automobile wreck.

While recovering he decided to embark on a major self-improvement drive. The result: His weight went down from 360 pounds to 197 pounds! He continues to eat no pork and no fried foods. He does strength training four days per week.

There has been much more excitement in this Democrat's young life. Be on the lookout for his book in 2023!

On November 6th Willie Rowe achieved the career goal of his life when he received the Oath of Office as Sheriff of Wake County.


