From there he went to work for Progressive Turnout Project and then went on to manage and work on various other campaigns – primarily in the mountains.





In 2021 Michael decided to run again for local office, this time for the Lenoir City Council. His goal was not only to win and bring a voice of the working class to the City Council but to also use his campaign as a model for organizing in deep red rural counties.

Although he did not win, he turned out new municipal voters, a fact for which he is proud.

Michael was soon appointed to the Lenoir Planning Board on which he currently serves.

He was formerly a Building Blue Regional Organizing Director for NCDP in 2011 and is a proud member of the newly organized NCDP Staff Union.

YOUNG DEMOCRATS OF NORTH CAROLINA!





Start your engines! That was the call for all the Democratic golfers in the last Brunswick Democratic Party's golf tournament – an event that was a fabulous financial success!


