During these years Isabel has sent hundreds of pictures of her fellow Henderson County Democrats as they were marching in parades, riding on vehicles in parades, gathering for sign-waving campaigns at prominent locations, rallying for many different Democratic causes, holding fundraising dinners, and staging their famous First Saturday Breakfasts.

Let's look into the life of Isabel Cutler and see what events and decisions have brought her to her current point of Democratic enthusiasm.

Isabel was born in Brooklyn in 1940 and her earliest memories are of pulling down the black shades during wartimes. Her father was an air raid warden.

She developed an interest in photography in her early teens and that interest has continued to grow all her life. That's why she enjoys making so many pictures of Henderson County Democrats.

She says: "School was not where I wanted to be but having graduated from high school when I was almost 16, I HAD to go to college and wound up at Hunter College where I majored in Sociology and minored in Music. I've loved cameras since childhood and was fortunate to have an uncle who mentored me and taught me darkroom skills. I put those skills to work while working for the Hunter College Arrow as a photographer. Isabel continues: "I finished my last two years of college at night and worked as a secretary during the day, having graduated from the Speedwriting School. When I learned that teachers were desperately needed and the salary was higher than I was getting as a secretary, I took some "emergency" courses and, eureka, I was a teacher.

"I taught elementary school in Harlem for six years and then another year on Long Island before I 'retired' and switched to teaching piano. I had been studying piano since the age of six and was blessed with perfect pitch, so the music studies were easy at first, until they weren't."





Isabel married Bill Cutler in 1967. In 1975 Bill's work with Grumman Aerospace took them to Germany for a year. The picture to the left shows them visiting Greece during their stay in Europe.

He and his wife, Marion, founded the New Beginnings Ministry of Faith 22 years ago; and his work in the community reflects his commitment to the Greater Good. After a run for NC House, he was elected First Vice Chair of the Craven County Democratic Party, serving two full terms. Charles sits on the Sheriff's Advisory Board, the Habitat for Humanity Board, and

the Coastal Community Action Board. An active member of his local volunteer fire department, he finds ways to assist the people of Craven County even during his "time off" - from cutting grass at a local cemetery to mentoring local candidates.

#### Helen and John Robinson

The dynamic team of Helen and John Robinson enriches the Craven County community by their unfaltering commitment to making the world a better place.

Helen has served on the Craven County Democratic Party Board for over six years, including as second vice chair, and is instrumental in keeping the precincts organized and active. She is a trainer par excellence. She is passionate about local environmental sustainability efforts and

These eponymous awards honor New Bern's first female alderman and Craven County's first elections supervisor, a lifelong Democrat who paved the way for local women in politics. Her laughter, Joan Orringer Shaffer, co-presented – with DWCC President Diane Lupton Tyndall – the 20<sup>th</sup> Century" award, which honors female trailblazers in Craven County, and the "21<sup>st</sup> Century" ward, which recognizes current and future leaders.



#### 20th Century Award: Beatrice Smith

Craven County Commissioner Beatrice "Bea" Smith brings to the job passion, loyalty, and hard work, qualities that have already seen her through a lifetime of service.

Smith began her career as a teacher in Craven County, advancing to become director of federal programs for the schools and retiring in 1997 as principal of Graham A. Barden Elementary School in Havelock. Five years later, she was sworn in as a member of the Craven County Board of Education, a seat she would hold until selected as a commissioner 19 years later by her fellow

ommissioners. She is the first African American woman to serve on the board, filling the seat acated by the death of long-serving Commissioner Johnnie Sampson.

n addition, Smith serves on the East Carolina Workforce Development Board, Juvenile Crime 'revention Board, and Coastal Community Action Head Start Board to "help and enhance the lives if citizens."

#### 21<sup>st</sup> Century Award: Jameesha Harris

lameesha Harris, the youngest African American woman lected to the New Bern Board of Aldermen, is the cobunder of Young Urban Professionals, an organization whose mission is to stimulate economic development mong marginalized business owners and entrepreneurs.

lameesha fights passionately for safe, affordable housing ind speaks out against injustice wherever she sees it, often rediting her New York upbringing for her fighting spirit.
