# YOUTH FEATURE: JUSTIN MATTHEWS, STATE HOUSE CANDIDATE!


JW Matthews is a 24 year-old ardent Democrat who works at a Walmart Distribution Center and is a student at Gardner-Webb University.






### **GUILFORD COUNTY GOTV TEAM!**





## POLK DEMOCRATS MARCH IN ST. PATRICKS DAY PARADE!


