Chair Clayton and celebrated our office opening in Forsyth County on May 18th!



Project 100: The Name Says It All

Project 100 is the NCDP's commitment to robust voter contact in every county in North Carolina. From Murphy to Manteo, the project is focused on educating and empowering voters across the state, working alongside county parties on door-to-door canvassing, phone banking, and text banking.

At the forefront of this initiative is the NCDP's Organizing Department, led by Organizing Director Sarah O'Brien and Regional Organizing Directors Daniel Franch, Michael Careccia and Brittany Lowder. These dedicated Regional Organizing Directors (RODs) are committed to ensuring that every vote counts in every county. Each of the RODs is building on their history and experience with grassroots organizing, having worked with the Democratic Party in 2022 on the "Building Blue" initiative.

To win North Carolina for Democrats in 2024, NCDP knew it needed to ensure no county went without resources and representation; thus Project 100 was born. "I think it says it all in the name...we want to reach all 100 counties," said Brittany Lowder.

Indeed, County Parties are at the heart of the P100 project. The Regional Organizers work alongside county party leadership to develop a localized canvass plan and to provide boots-on-theground support to mobilize voters in the 30+ counties of their regions. For Michael Careccia, one of the three RODs spearheading Project 100, the initiative was born out of a deep-rooted commitment to grassroots organizing. «The group that we have now with Project 100, and we got more folks coming aboard, but the three of us, we became very passionate about needing to make sure that our county parties, all 100 of the county parties, were doing everything they could,» he explains.

Carceccia is Regional Organizing Director for Western North Carolina. «We started putting together...what we left off with Building Blue. [We] wanted to make it so much more laser-focused on getting people out to vote in these counties, but also building the volunteer capacity for the county parties,» said Careccia.

He emphasized that «with the crucial election coming up, we really can't afford to leave any county behind, even if they are an unorganized county party. We want to knock doors and make phone calls there.

While Careccia works with points west of Forsyth County, Brittany Lowder is the Regional Organizing Director for Eastern NC. "I'm proud, really proud of all of my counties...it's great to see the growth in so many counties," said Lowder.

Project 100: The Name Says It All

Lowder has been volunteering since Obama's campaign is overwhelmed by the growth she has witnessed over time. "In the past, maybe there haven't been the resources to reach all of those counties. And maybe folks felt like they weren't included but now that we have the resources I think it's great that we're able to reach everyone."

Every Tuesday and Thursday, the RODs are leading phone banking efforts, and on Saturdays, they are canvassing and visiting voters rain or shine. «When I worked with NCDP in 2022, I actually was canvassing pregnant,» Lowder shares. «If a pregnant lady can get out there and do all that, there's no reason why you can't join us.»

Project 100 is not just reaching out to voters but inspiring them to volunteer. Working with voters on door-to-door canvassing and phone banking is one of the most rewarding ways to connect with communities. «I've met so many incredible people, and they have been so welcoming to me and want this project to succeed. They're glad that we're there,» says Lowder.

Direct voter contact works, and the proof is in the pudding, or rather in the data, as Daniel Franch reminds us.

"The data doesn't lie...the studies are clear that for every packet of 30 to 40 doors that we take out between now and November, we confirm the vote of one additional Democratic candidate or one additional vote for our Democratic candidates...this direct voter contact work is the most important work that we can do as a state party," said Franch.

Daniel Franch is a ROD for the Piedmont region and a former history high school teacher. He finds joy in using his teaching skills to educate voters of all ages. «I'm grateful to be able to do this every day and at the same time, still use a lot of my teaching skills that I learned... I'm teaching everyday people of all ages, especially adults,» he says. «I really enjoy that opportunity and feel like I'm making a tremendous difference every day, which matters a lot.»

The Organizing Department truly is making a tremendous difference by leading grassroots efforts in all 100 counties. These directors are committed to ensuring no county is left behind. Every week, they are fostering direct connections with voters, volunteers and community members. Ahead of the 2024 elections, Project 100 is paving the way for a brighter and bluer future for North Carolina.


